

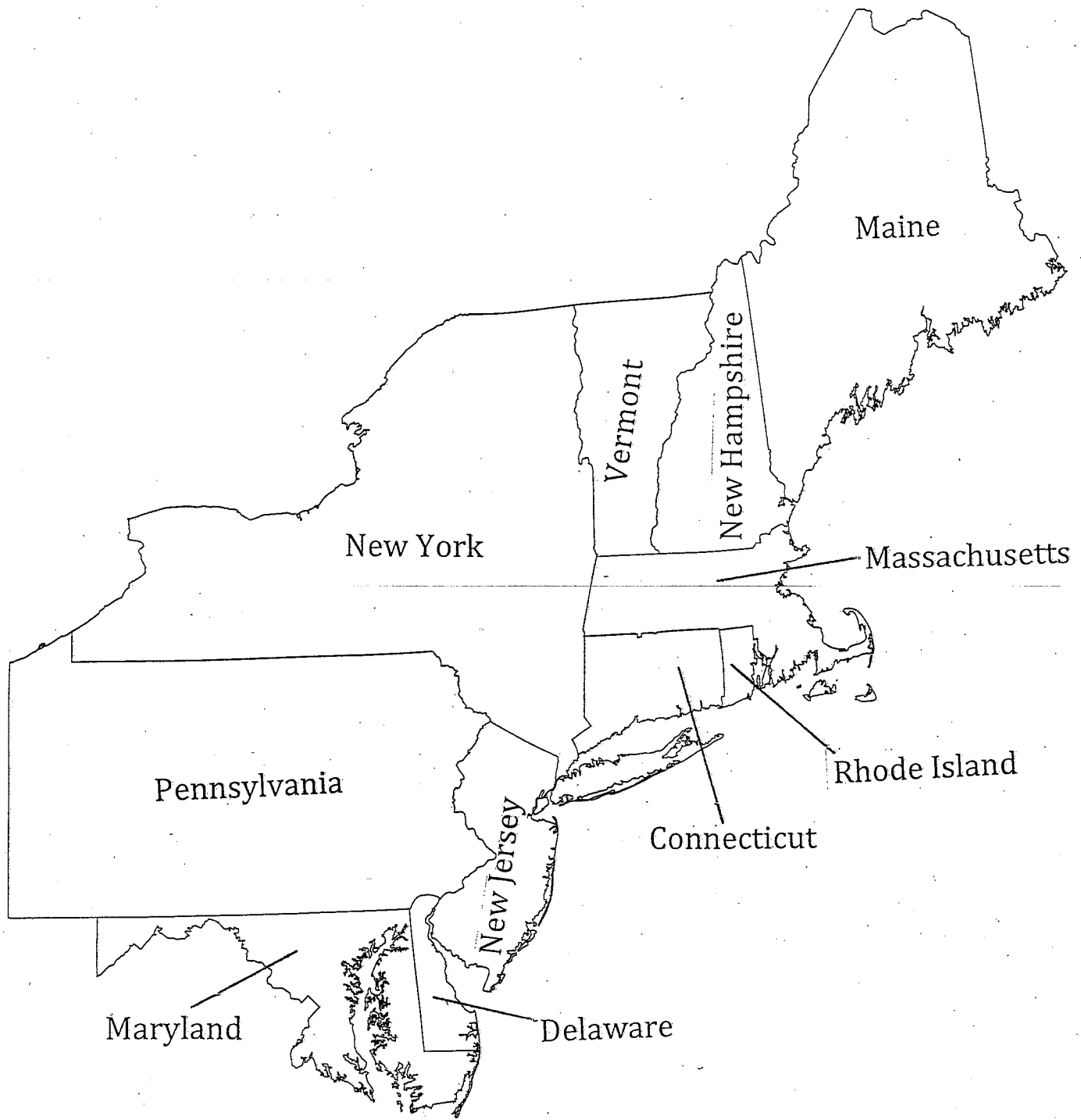

Chapter 4- A Train Tour of the Northeast

You will need to know the following concepts:

1. The geography of the Northeast Region today includes mountain ranges and peaks, miles of ocean coastline, and many harbors.
2. A democracy is a form of government in which the people choose leaders. There are no kings or queens- the leaders are chosen in elections.
3. Our nation gained its freedom from England by fighting and winning the Revolutionary War.
4. The Erie Canal allows boats to travel from New York City to Lake Erie. Those boats carry people and vital goods.
5. New York City is described as a city of immigrants and skyscrapers.
6. Mass production is a way of making very large quantities (amounts) of the same product.
7. The Constitution protects your right to freedom of speech. This means that you have the legal right to say what you think, without fear of arrest or imprisonment by the government.
8. The three branches of government are:
 - Legislative- Congress makes laws for our country
 - Executive- the President is the head of this branch. It makes sure the nation's laws are carried out.
 - Judicial- made up of the nations' courts. It guarantees that the nation's laws are obeyed.
9. The first factories in the Northeast were filled mostly by women and girls who were willing to work long, hard days.
